Be Mindful of Summer Safety!

Summer brings many enjoyable activities like walks and picnics, but it also presents some challenges for pet owners, such as parasites, hot pavement and pets that like to escape. It's important to know how best to protect our pets and keep them safe during the summer.

Parasites

Protecting your dog and/or cat with preventive medications is crucial for preventing parasites like fleas, ticks, heartworms and intestinal parasites.



Hot Pavement



As the weather warms and the sun intensifies, the ground, especially pavement, can become extremely hot. When walking your dog, it's best to let them walk on grassy areas whenever possible, as pavement can quickly become too hot for their paws. Even when the air temperature is between 60 and 70 degrees, pavement temperatures can reach around 115 degrees. Protecting your dog's paws from burns is essential. A good rule of thumb is: if the pavement is too hot for your bare feet, it's likely too hot for your dog's paws.

Microchipping



Warmer weather often means more time outdoors for our pets, which, while enjoyable, also increases the risk of them escaping or getting lost. Microchipping your dog or cat is crucial for ensuring their safe return home should they ever become lost. If your pet is found by animal control or a concerned citizen, a quick scan of their microchip will provide immediate identification and your contact information. If your pet isn't microchipped, please schedule an appointment with us. Microchipping provides peace of mind, significantly increasing the chances of your beloved companion being returned home safely.
