Winter Safety Tips:

- Ensure your pets have a warm place to rest indoors, away from drafts, and provide cozy bedding. Provide extra warmth and comfort for senior pets, as they may be more sensitive to the cold. Keep pets away from space heaters, as they can pose burn risks. Instead, opt for pet-safe warming pads if needed.
- **Use pet-friendly ice melt on walkways and consider booties to protect paws from cold surfaces and harsh chemicals. Be cautious with antifreeze as it's toxic to pets. Clean up spills promptly and store it out of reach.
- Limit outdoor exposure in extreme cold, especially for short-haired or elderly pets. Engaging pets in indoor activities helps to keep them active and mentally stimulated during colder days.
- Towel-dry your pet thoroughly after they've been outside, especially if they've come into contact with snow or rain. Regularly groom your pets to remove excess fur, preventing mats that can trap snow and moisture.
- Inspect your pet's ears, paws, and tail for signs of frostbite after outdoor activities. Monitor for signs of winter allergies, such as dry or itchy skin. If you notice any redness or swelling, consult your vet.

Remember, each pet is unique, so tailor these tips to your individual pet's needs!

~Peanut Butter Cookies~

Ingredients

2 cups whole wheat flour

1 cup natural peanut butter

1 cup skim milk

1 tbsp baking powder

Directions:

-Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

-Combine the peanut butter and milk in another bowl, then add to the dry ingredients.

-Roll to 1/4" thick.

-Cut into squares or use cookie cutters of your choice

-Bake at 375 degrees for 20 minutes.

Cookies should be dry after baking.

~Tuna Tidbits~

Ingredients

6 ounce can of tuna

1/4 cup water drained from tuna

3 T cooked egg white, chopped

1/4 cup cornmeal

1/2 cup whole wheat flour

Directions:

-Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

-Combine tuna, egg white and water.

-Add cornmeal and flour and blend to form dough.

-Knead into a ball and roll to 1/4 inch thick.

-Cut into one-inch sized pieces.

-Bake at 350 F for 20 minutes.

Let cool and serve!
